Many archers did not have a previous rating, so one was calculated using the David Luyer online rating table¹ using the first 30 arrows. This was compared with the rating for the whole shoot. So if the last 30 arrows were better, rating improvement was entered into the results table above. Because

the original spreadsheet was constructed for Excel 2003, I had to use that program to insert the new archers with these initial ratings. The remaining data entry was done using Microsoft Excel 2007.

Congratulations to Brian on a two point rating improvement! He's going to need all his performance to compete overseas in September! Also, congratulations to Andrew Campbell and Norman Lawrence who got better as they went along. Finally, Kelvin Spann has an excellent rating, and shot EXACTLY the same score for the first and the final 30 arrows!

Sharp eyes will have noticed Andrew Fluck is using a recurve freestyle bow TEMPORARILY until he gets a new longbow. The new bow gave him a rating jump from 25 to 44, showing new equipment CAN make a difference. He also scored his first all-gold end.


