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Clint Freeman goes well

Clint has ranked 20th in the Compound Individual Men, losing the 1/8 Elimination Match #4 on Oct 5 to Welshman Owen Kalmaru (173 to Clint's 170). The Australian compound men's team (Patrick Coghlan, Clint Freeman & Robert Timms) did very well, getting to the Bronze medal match against South Africa. Many will have heard about the timing problems encountered, and how the team members considered an appeal which could have ruled out one of the opposing team's arrows. At this level, such an outcome would have been worth 9 or 10 points – and the South Africans won by only two points (234 to Australia's 232). However, the appeal was only contemplated, not registered because the officials felt the South Africans were actually more disadvantaged through the problem.

At Yamuna sports complex the men's recurve team final match result on Friday 8 Oct gave Australia (Matthew Gray, Matthew Masonwells & Taylor Worth with 219) a win over Malaysia (212). Gold for Australia!

The iCub robot learns archery

Humanoid robot iCub learns the skill of archery. The learning algorithm, called ARCHER (Augmented Reward Chained Regression) algorithm, was developed and optimized specifically for problems like the archery training. After being taught how to hold a bow and shoot an arrow, it learned for itself how to improve its aim, and was so successful it could hit a bullseye after 8 trials. The iCub robot is an open-source robotic platform about the same size as a child three and a half years old, or around 104 cm tall.



New QRE choice

Archery Australia has changed QRE rounds for <u>open</u> recurve and compound archers to a choice of:

• 72 arrows at 70 metres, 122 cm face (FITA 720 @ 70m)

72 arrows at 50 metres, 80 cm face (FITA 720 @ 50m)
36 arrows at 70 metres plus 36 arrows at 50 metres taken from either a 144 arrow FITA 90 metre or FITA 70 metre round The number of arrows per end can be either 3 or 6 at the discretion of the organising body (AA, RGB or club).

Members of Paringa Archers will have priority in the far lane (targets 15 & 16) on Saturday mornings during the public Come & Try session.
